MK328 SPY RADIO



The Mark 328 was a solid-state miniature clandestine receiver developed by HMGCC at Hanslope Park (UK) c: 1970.

It was the last in the long line of British spy radios.

Its compact, modern design was well thought out and was housed in a modern Tupperware box, for compact concealed storage.

Only a limited number were made, as by the 70's was safer for undercover agents to use message drops, or public phone boxes.

This particular unit was purchased form Northern Ireland, where it may have seen action during the troubles, by undercover agents.

By the 1980's Spy and Special Forces mainly used encrypted versions, of standard military radios.
